DILG: More than 26K contact tracers hired and deployed to LGUs

More than 26,872 Contact Tracers (CTs) across the country have already been hired and are already deployed to various local government units (LGUs) according to the DILG.

DILG Secretary Eduardo M. Año confirmed this saying that all DILG provincial and city offices are processing applications to ensure at least 50,000 CTs as prescribed under the Bayanihan To Heal As One Act will be hired by the department in order to cut the transmission of COVID-19 in all provinces of the country.

"Even prior to the signing of the Bayanihan 2 Law, the DILG field offices were already preparing for the recruitment, hiring, and training of the new contact tracers. And now, a few weeks after the signing of the law, more than 26,000 have already been hired and deployed to the various provinces," Año said. Read more

UNHRC reso welcome devt on PH human rights efforts--DILG

The DILG welcomes the passage of the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) resolution expressing support and cooperation for the country's efforts to protect human rights in the country.

"The UNHCR resolution is a welcome development on the part of the Inter-agency Committee on Anti-Illegal Drugs (ICAD) Advocacy Cluster headed by the DILG. This move is a recognition that the government's approach against illegal drugs is holistic. We are not only focusing on the supply reduction side but also on the demand reduction aspect," said DILG Secretary Eduardo M. Año.

Adopted during the council's 45th session in Geneva, Switzerland, the said UNHCR resolution called for technical assistance and capacity building for domestic efforts on human rights between the Philippine government and the Office of Human Rights Council (OHCHR).

As the importance of Universal Healthcare (UHC) was emphasized by the pandemic, the DILG and the Department of Health (DOH) are working to further strengthen the Barangay Health Response Teams (BHERTs) and announced the ways forward in reinforcing them during a recent DOH media forum.

Health Undersecretary Maria Rosario Singh-Vergeire emphasized the role of BHERTs, reiterating the statement of Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III that they are the country's first line of defense in the communities. "Ang mga BHERT friends po natin ang pangunahing health defense sa ating community ngayong pandemic," said Usec. Singh-Vergeire.

For his part, DILG Undersecretary and Spokesperson Jonathan Malaya explained that each local government unit's BHERTs carry a big responsibility and require adequate support in fulfilling their roles. Read more

A simulation exercise followed in the afternoon wherein the newly hired contact tracers were given a feel of what to expect once deployed in the LGUs. Field Officers served as observers and provided inputs on how the CTs can further improve their skills.


